

A Brief Biography of Pastor Marvin Smith

Marvin E. Smith III was born on December 12, 1956, in Marietta, Georgia. His father, Marvin Smith Jr., passed away shortly after Pastor Smith's third birthday in 1960. His mother then moved the family to St. Clair, Missouri, to be near her parents.

It was in St. Clair that Pastor Smith walked the aisle of the First Baptist Church and trusted Christ as his Savior. The year was 1964, and

the preacher was his own grandfather.

In his late teen years the Spirit of God was dealing with Brother Smith concerning full time Christian service. In his senior year of high school he submitted to the Spirit's leadership by surrendering to preach. He then began to preach anywhere that he was allowed.

He and his wife, Alice,, were married on August 7, 1996 and have

been faithfully serving the Lord together ever since.

One year after he surrendered to preach he became the bus director and children's church pastor of the Mt. Zion Baptist Church, the church Pastor Smith was then attending. The church experienced tremendous growth with many souls saved and a high day of 1,015 in attendance. Brother Smith served at Mt. Zion from 1977 to 1993.

In 1993, through a course of events and a clear call from the Lord, the Smiths, (Brother Smith, his wife, Alice, daughter, Jamie, and son, Marvin) moved to Fort Dodge, Iowa, to lead a small group of people who desired to start a soul winning church. The first Sunday, 21 people met to worship in the basement of the Budget Host Inn. The people of the Harvest Baptist Church purchased the Silver Spur Saloon in April of 1994, and converted it into the church's new home. The church has now grown to an average attendance of over 500 people.

Pastor Smith was lead by God to start Harvest Baptist School (K4-12th grade) and Harvest Baptist Bible College.. He also started Bibles for the World, which has printed hundreds of thousands of Bibles and


millions of gospel tracts;

Automobiles

Students are allowed to have an automobile on campus but must register the vehicle at the time of class registration. Proof of insurance and a valid driver's license must be presented at this time

Student Attire

All students must attend classes and church services in proper attire. Men must attend classes in a shirt, tie and appropriate dress pants. Ladies must attend classes in a modest dress, or skirt and blouse. Students are not to wear denim to classes. Dress shoes must be worn to classes, chapel, and church. The complete student dress code is available upon request.

Employment

Harvest Baptist Bible College does not charge a tuition fee, students, therefore, may not have to work as many hours off campus as do students in other Bible colleges. Although this is true, many students do have the need to seek employment in the Fort Dodge area. The agricultural and chemical industries as well as retail businesses, restaurants, custodial employers, and other places of opportunity provide many jobs for our students. Young ladies may work off campus, but they do have some restrictions concerning hours and places of employment.

Work Scholarship Program

The work scholarship program allows Harvest Baptist Bible College to keep the cost of education down while teaching valuable character truths to each of our students. Students will be allowed to work approximately eight hours per week for the college doing various tasks. These tasks might include; janitorial work, office work, assisting faculty and staff, shoveling snow, painting, etc.

Work scholarship students can earn \$50 cash per week from Harvest Baptist Bible College. A student can choose to be given the \$50 or have it applied to their next semesters school bill.

Degrees Offered

Bachelor of Science - 128 credit hours

The Bachelor of Science degree is offered with majors in the following fields of study: Pastoral Theology, Pastoral Assistant, Missions, Education, and General Christian Studies.

Associates Degree - 64 credit hours

The Associates Degree is offered in the field of Biblical Studies or General Studies

Masters Degree – 32 credit hours

The Masters Degree is offered in Spiritual Warfare Counseling. It is done by correspondence for the minimal cost of \$800.

Emphasis on Bible and Counseling All degrees from Harvest Baptist Bible College will be considered Bible degrees. All students will receive training in Biblical counseling as a concentration field and will have that designation on their diploma.

Course Descriptions

Department of Bible

BI-101 Old Testament Survey

This class offers an overview of the thirty-nine books of the Old Testament placing each book in its chronological and historical setting. Divisions, themes, key words and phrases, outlines, and major doctrines will be emphasized.

BI-102 New Testament Survey

This class offers an overview of the twenty-seven books of the New Testament placing each book in its chronological and historical setting. Divisions, themes, key words and phrases, outlines, and major doctrines will be emphasized.

BI-103 Genesis

The Book of Beginnings is given close scrutiny as the student learns of the foundational history of the universe, mankind, and the Hebrew race.

BI-104 Gospels

This class is an in-depth look at the earthly ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ through the window of the first four books of the New Testament.

BI-201 Exodus-Deuteronomy

Emphasizing the great doctrinal pictures developed in the tabernacle, the law, the sacrificial system, and the history of Israel, the balance of the Pentateuch is presented.

BI-202 Romans

The study of Paul's epistle to the Romans is rich in fundamental doctrines such as Salvation, the Old and New Natures, Justification, Grace and many others. This class will give these major themes close attention.

BI-203 Daniel and Revelation

It is common to teach these books together as they share dynamic prophetic truths from the Old and New Testaments. Students will see the practical application of these truths as well as get a view of what is in store in the rapidly approaching future.

BI-204 Acts

The exciting events and doctrines of this historical New Testament book will challenge each student to become more in touch with the power of the Holy Spirit. This early history of the Church Age gives instruction for today's ministries.

BI-301 Bible Doctrines I

This course will cover the major Bible doctrines of Bibliology (the study of the Bible) and Theology (the doctrine of God).

BI-302 Bible Doctrines II

This course will cover the major Bible doctrines of Pneumatology (the doctrine of the Holy Spirit) and Christology (the doctrine of Christ).

BI-303 Major Prophets

The books of Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations and Ezekiel will be covered in this exciting class. Major themes, specific prophecies, and doctrinal insights from these books will be discussed and carefully studied.

BI-304 Poetry and Wisdom

The books of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon are taught with special attention given to devotional elements and character development.

BI-305 Historical Books

This course provides a presentation of the historical books of the Bible, Joshua through Esther. This study includes the time span from the arrival of the Hebrew nation in the Promised Land through the return from Babylonian captivity.

BI-306 Cults

The origins and false teachings of the major cults will be considered in this class. Sound, Biblical responses to these teachings will be given.

BI-307 Biblical Hermeneutics

One of the greatest needs a Christian has is the need to be able to study the Bible for one's self. This class will give detailed steps to successful, comprehensive Bible study.

BI -401 Bible Doctrines III

This course will cover the major Bible doctrines of Anthropology (the doctrine of man), Hamartiology (the doctrine of sin), and Soteriology (the doctrine of salvation)

BI-402 Bible Doctrines IV

This course will cover the major Bible doctrines of Angelology (the doctrine of angels), Ecclesiology (the doctrine of the church), and Eschatology (the doctrine of things to come).

BI-403 Pauline Epistles

This careful exposition of Paul's epistles is designed to prepare the student for a deeper understanding of this portion of Scripture. Direction for church leadership is emphasized.

.BI-404 Hebrews

This course provides a complete study of the book of Hebrews demonstrating the superiority of Jesus Christ to all aspects of the Old Testament system of sacrifice, the law, and the Priesthood.

BI-405 Bible Translations

This advanced Bible course is a complete examination of the superiority of the King James Bible and its relationship to the *Textus Receptus*. A comparison of The King James to corrupt translations is done.

BI-406 General Epistles

This class offers a close look at the general epistles which will provide the student with better understanding of doctrinal truth and prepare him for meaningful expository preaching. The consistency of Scripture between Paul's writings and these epistles will be studied.

BI-407 Minor Prophets

This course sets the background for the books of Hosea through Malachi, examining their messages and revisiting their ministries. Great Fundamental truths will be examined in these often considered obscure books.







Department of Church Ministry

CM-101 Personal Evangelism

This how-to course is designed to instruct students in effectively leading souls to Christ in one-on-one situations. This very important class is required for all majors.

CM-201 The Bus Ministry

Complete training in how to lead a bus ministry is the purpose of this class. Visitation, bus programs, route organization, vehicle purchasing, vehicle maintenance, and working with personnel are covered in this exciting course.

CM-202 Building the Sunday School

This course is designed to discuss curriculum development, teacher training, methods that produce numerical growth, classroom management, visitation and many other aspects of a successful Sunday School program.

CM- 203 The Youth Ministry

This course teaches how to successfully direct a youth ministry. Some of the topics include teen soul winning, music, standards, coordinating with the home and the Christian school, activities, and camps.

CM-204 Ministering to Children

The essential elements of keeping a child's attention, program content, and communication for children's ministries will be covered in this class. Practical instruction in the use of flannel graph, puppets, games and storytelling will be given careful attention. Students will also be trained in how to lead a child to Christ.

CM-205 Church Education

Learning the overall operation of a Church and its ministries is the thrust of this important class. Information and instruction in Soulwinning programs, church nurseries, hospital visitation, baptism, Lord's Supper, office operations, staff and many other topics will be considered in this class.

CM-206 Local Church Music

Music plays an important role in the church ministry. This class will present the use of music for worship and preparation for preaching. Choir, special music, congregational singing, offertory, and accompaniment will be considered.

CM-301 Printing

Students in this coarse will learn the basics of operating printing presses and binding machines. They will help to print tracts and booklets that will go around the world.

CM-401 New Testament Church Planting

Gods plan for world evangelization as seen in the book of Acts is taught to students in this course. Both the practical issues of starting a church and the spiritual preparation of the founding pastor are covered in this course.

CM-402 Pastoral Internship

The pastoral internship program is based on students completing a minimum of 200 hours of field work under the direct supervision of one or more approved pastors. Internship hours, nature of the work done, and mentors' assessments will be compiled in an internship file to validate the student's experience. Journaling, sermon and lesson outlines, and any other written work will also be compiled to add credibility.

Department of Counseling

CO-101 Spiritual Warfare Counseling I

Spiritual warfare counseling teaches the student how to reveal satanic lies, tear down satanic strongholds, and set captives free. This course will be taken twice in every four year program.

CO-102 Marriage Counseling

With more than fifty percent of all marriages failing, the need for sound, Biblical, marriage counseling is clear. Students will be taught to analyze the problems and offer wise solutions that are based upon Bible principles.

CO-301 Spiritual Warfare Counseling II

Students will have an opportunity to study this very important topic a second time in their four year program. New material will be introduced as well as the reinforcement of topics previously covered.

CO-302 Advanced Counseling

Bible based answers, and counseling techniques for complex problems such as cutting, schizophrenia, eating disorders, and bipolar disorder are discussed in this class.

CO-303 Youth Counseling

This course is designed to prepare youth workers for giving spiritual guidance while counseling young people. Attention is given to legal guidelines and ethical procedures concerning this important work.

CO-302 Human Growth and Development

An understanding of the human growth process is a helpful tool for counselors and educators as they attempt to nurture others. This course considers the stages of development from conception through old age.

CO-401 Educational Psychology

A study of the intellectual development of school age children is essential to the educator. This course will explore the implementation of teaching techniques for different learning styles while taking student maturity levels into account.

Department of Education

ED-201 Methods of Education

The Seven Laws of Teaching by John Milton Gregory will be the textbook for this foundational education course. Students will learn the fundamental steps necessary to communicate truth.

ED-202 General Teaching Methods

Students will learn the rudiments of pedagogy in this important class. Curriculum survey, classroom communication, parent teacher communication, lesson plans, and other important related topics will be covered.

ED-203 Classroom Procedures

Testing, grading, homework, points and percentages, grade book management and classroom discipline are taught in this class for the student of the teaching process.

ED-204 Educational Field Experience

The nature of this class is to prepare the participant for teaching internship. The student will record classroom observations of pupils, and procedures.

ED-301 Elements of Education I

Future teachers will learn how to teach elementary students specific areas of study in this class. This first course of two will include teaching history, science, math, and arts and crafts.

ED-302 Elements of Education II

This second course outlines the instructional methods available for teaching elementary students phonics, reading, language arts, and music.

ED-401 Education Seminar

This class provides hands-on guidance to the teacher in training through the use of group dialogue. Discussion for improving techniques, classroom management, and other classroom issues.

ED-402 Teaching Internship

This Teaching Internship program will occupy one full semester. Student teachers will observe veteran teachers as they function in their classrooms. They will then work with a designated teacher performing classroom tasks under close tutorial observation. Thorough documentation of the student's activities will be compiled and evaluated for grading and assignment of credits.

ED-403 Christian School Administration

The many facets of Christian school management are included in this course. Hiring and development of staff, curriculum selection, communication, finances, budgets, buildings, athletics and many other important topics are thoroughly considered.

Department of English

EN-101 English Grammar

The basics of English grammar including the eight parts of speech, sentence analysis, and diagramming are taught in this class. Basic writing skills are introduced.

EN -102 English Composition

Students will be challenged to develop their writing skills in this class. The student will practice the basic elements of research and composition.

EN-103 Fundamentals of Speech

The principles of public speaking will be studied in this class. Students will take part in the giving of several types of speeches before the other students.

EN-201 American Literature

Exposure to and analysis of the great works of American authors will covered in this class. Biographies of outstanding writers and the development of the short story will also be considered.

EN-301 Writing Seminar

This advanced course is designed to help students develop their writing skills. Church ministry applications such as pamphlets, bulletins, brochures, essays and letters will be given primary attention.

EN-302 Children's Literature

The important works of children's literature will be given close study in this interesting class. The styles of writing that compose this genre will be viewed in light of Biblical truth.



EN-303 Homiletics I

Sermon preparation including study and outlining will be the focus of this course. Students will learn to develop a text into a message.

EN-304 Homiletics II

Sermon delivery will be the focus of this course. Effective preaching techniques and care of the voice will be covered in detail.

Department of History

HS-201 Baptist History

The history of the Baptists will be given close consideration in this course. Founded by the Lord Jesus Christ and preserved throughout modern times, the history of the Baptists will give students a sense of excitement as they contemplate their place in this great work.

HS-202 History of Missions

This course is a study of the history of missions started in the book of Acts and continued throughout the world today. Students will be encouraged to do their God ordained part in this history of world evangelism.



Department of Personal Development

PD-101 Personal Leadership

Learning to lead yourself is fundamental to the success of any person's life. In this class students will learn how to schedule and prioritize their time, develop good study habits, and handle their personal finances.

PD-102 The Spirit Filled Life

Students must learn to walk with God if they are to succeed in serving Him. The Spirit filled life is necessary to those who truly desire this close walk with the Lord. This class gives insight into living this life.

PD-103 Leadership from the Gospels

Close observation of the life of Christ as found in the Gospels will reveal many leadership traits that we should incorporate into our lives. To lead as the Lord Himself led is the finest form of leadership.

PD-201 The Godly Woman

Young ladies will learn the Biblical traits of the Godly woman in this class. Ladies will have the opportunity to discuss the very important leadership roles God has ordained for them.

PD-202 The Godly Man

Character traits of the Godly man will be the concern of this exciting class. Elements of leadership for the home and the church will be taught.

PD-203 Spirit Filled Woman

Applications of the Spirit filled life that are unique to women are discussed in this class. Ladies will be encouraged to bear the fruit of the Spirit in their personal walk.

PD-301 Parenting in the Ministry

Balancing the pressures of the full time ministry with the responsibilities that come with parenting has been a challenge for



Department of Missions

MS-201 Cults and World Religions

This survey of the world's major religions will give insight for missionary soulwinners. Bible truth will be presented to teach strategies for combating false doctrine of these religions.

MS-301 The Missions Program

This class explores the directive to the local church for reaching the world with the Gospel of Christ. Faith promise giving, missions conferences, and mission trips are some of the topics covered.

MS-401 Preparation for Deputation

Effective deputation is the main focus of this class. How to present your burden through video presentations, prayer letters, and display boards will be discussed. Students will also be instructed in how to schedule meetings and be a blessing to host churches and pastors.

MS-403 Mission Internship

The mission internship will consist of one mission trip and participation in Missionary Boot Camp. These experiences will be chronicled by the use of student journaling, assessments by mentoring missionaries, and a compilation of sermon notes, Sunday school lessons, and other pertinent observations and experiences.

MS-405 Missions Seminar

This "catch all" class covers every subject related to missions. This class is taught by veteran missionaries, missionaries on deputation or furlough, and others experienced in world missions.
